Answers to Scenarios

- 1. Race Discrimination
 - The applicant's credentials were not considered for the decision, only her race.
- 2. Other harassment
 - This is color discrimination, as the man commented on the lightness of the woman's skin.
- 3. Other harassment
 - This behavior is sexual harassment, according to DoDI 1020.04.
- 4. Race Discrimination
 - The supervisor called the employee's race out specifically and made degrading comments about it. It is still discrimination even if the target laughs or continues the joke.
- 5. Other harassment
 - This is sex discrimination, as the comments were pointed toward the fact that she is a woman.
