Each year, on the third Monday in January, the Department of Defense stands alongside the nation in honoring the life and enduring influence of *Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.*

Remember! Celebrate! Act!

A Day on, Not A Day Off! He is celebrated as a champion of nonviolence in America and as a prominent figure in the Civil Rights Movement.

This year holds particular significance, it marks the 60th anniversary of *King* being awarded the Nobel Prize for Peace.



At the age of thirty-five, *Dr. King* was the youngest man to have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

Gunner Jahn, the chairman of the Nobel committee, credited King for being "...the first person in the Western world to have shown us that a struggle can be waged without violence. He is the first to make the message of brotherly love a reality. In the course of his struggle, he has brought this message to all men, to all nations and races."

While others were advocating for freedom by "any means necessary," *King* used the power of words and acts of nonviolent resistance, such as protests, grassroots organizing, and civil disobedience to achieve seemingly impossible goals.




The prize money awarded to *King* was \$54,123. Today that would be over \$400,000!

What Do You Know about the Nobel Prize?

On November 27, 1895, *Alfred Nobel* signed his last will and testament, giving the largest share of his fortune to a series of prizes in physics, chemistry, physiology or medicine, literature and peace – the Nobel Prizes.

In 1968, Sveriges Riksbank (Sweden's central bank) established The Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel.

Do you know why the individuals and organizations awarded a Nobel Prize are called Nobel Prize laureates?

In Greek mythology, the god Apollo is represented wearing a laurel wreath on his head. The wreath is a circular crown made of branches and leaves of the bay laurel (in Latin: Laurus nobilis).

In Ancient Greece, laurel
wreaths were awarded
to victors as a sign
of honor – both in
athletic competitions
and in poetic meets.

Do you know the youngest and the oldest prize winners?

Malala Yousafzai was 17-years-old when she was awarded the Nobel Prize for Peace in 2014.

John B. Goodenough was 97-years-old when he received the prize in Chemistry in 2019.

Do you know what laureates receive with their award?

At the Nobel Prize award ceremonies they receive three things: a Nobel Prize diploma, a Nobel Prize medal and a document confirming the Nobel Prize amount.

Each diploma is a unique work of art, created by foremost Swedish and Norwegian artists and calligraphers.

The medals are handmade with careful precision and in 18-karat recycled gold.
