Poster Description: The 2024 Women's History Month poster consists of color and black and white photographs highlighting 47 military and civilian women who have inspired others through their professional and personal achievements throughout the years.

Around the poster's edge is a fine, light grey border that resembles a picture frame. The main poster area is a textured, teal-colored background. Just within the teal background and arranged around the poster's edges are the 47 photographs of these inspirational leaders. The women reflected are:

Centered at the poster's top and spread across six lines is the observance theme in large, capitalized, white font, **WOMEN WHO HAVE MADE GREAT ACHIEVEMENTS**.

Centered beneath the theme in smaller, capitalized dark yellow font is the observance title and month spread across two lines. The first line reads, **WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH**. The second line in smaller font reads, **MARCH**.

Centered beneath the observance and title are the seals for the Department of Defense and the Defense Equal Opportunity Management Institute (DEOMI). To the right of the seals are two Quick Response Codes (QRC) and a white symbol depicting a microphone. When scanned with a mobile device the first QRC will direct an individual to DEOMI's website, www.deomi.mil. The second QRC will open an audio narration with this poster description.
